


My best wishes go to all our bowlers for the coming Season. Let's Go Hornets!

Approximately 60 volunteer members and partners attended. The night was fun and informative.


#### We had four speakers:

After the presentations we enjoyed a lovely supper. Thanks to the Social committee who prepared the supper and organised the night. Thanks to Vonnie who baked the desserts.


