Good luck to our Saturday Div 4 (red) side contesting the finals on 27 March.



#### **RULES AND COMMENTS BY PETER HURT**

I was asked a couple of questions recently, "A driven bowl hit the bank hard and bounced back onto the green. Is it a live bowl?" and "A bowl from the neighbouring rink was bearing down on our bowls. It was on the correct bias. Do I have to lift one or more of our bowls to let it pass?"

**Answer 1**. No. Rule 17.1.4 "Once it passes outside the boundaries of the rink..." it is a dead bowl. Unless... Rule 17.2.3 "it is a toucher which rebounds..."

Answer 2. No. Rule 37.6.1 "If a bowl at rest on the rink is in danger of being moved by a bowl from a neighbouring rink, any player must choose:" and I paraphrase, "to either lift a bowl to allow it to pass (only if it would not influence the outcome i.e. a measurable bowl) or stop the bowl from the neighbouring rink." Incidentally if you are a marker there is NO option, you must stop the bowl.

I notice that Bowls S.A. has a number of sessions that umpires, measurers and others might wish to attend. Be aware that the "Skills Sessions" are not the same as accreditation, though both are worth attending. Check their website for upcoming dates.

Today at Playford I appealed to the umpire, who I thought would be aware of the rules and policies. How wrong I was! It goes to show that it's not enough to think you know the rules, one must actually know them, or if in doubt admit it!

Bowl S.A. uses Bowls Australia policies, and there are a few. A lesson here for us all. Read the rules and policies!

**5.1.4 "Whenever a player commences** using an approved bowler's arm in a game, the player must use it for the remainder of that game. This does not apply to the rolling of the jack, which can be rolled either by hand or by a bowler's arm."

By the way the Club needs more umpires and measurers. Many umpires of the last few seasons are no longer accredited. See Bowls S.A. website for details of upcoming courses for accreditation.

As an extra, a player gave me a saying he would like printed, and it is a truism, "Second wood is golden". If one can get and keep it the team either wins the end or only goes down by one point.

#### **FRIDAY SOCIAL BOWLS**


Friday morning social bowls continues the entire year (weather permitting). Starting time changes to 10:30 for 11:00 start on the green after Easter, Friday, 9 April.

It has been a very successful year with Junior Hornets at Hope Valley Bowling Club. We have continued our success from the first year with up to 30 children now coming to try Lawn Bowls in our first 2 years of the junior coaching. We haven't retained all of the children but we have given them a taste of lawn bowls and hope to get them back in the future. We continue to have about 15 children attend every week of the coaching clinic. At present we have 2 representatives of the program added to the under 18's training squad in the silver team, that is the best 18 junior bowlers in the state. That is a credit to both of them as they are both only twelve years old and both are playing open



division pennants on Saturday at the Club. Congratulations to Kobe Jarman and Cameron Jamison on this achievement.

Next season we hoping to have at least 4 U18's playing pennants on Saturday to increase our profile as a Club that is supporting juniors to come through and help our Club in the future. We also have at least one team, maybe more, playing Winter Social Bowls on Saturday afternoons this season, following the successful team of 4 juniors playing together at Night Owls right throughout summer. Our aim of this was to give the kids a chance to play in a more competitive environment together, to develop their skills in a match situation. Six children got a taste of this and seemed to enjoy the experience without feeling out of place. We would like to thank Bob Basedow for accommodating the junior team and for the way the Night Owlers accepted and encouraged them. They would definitely have increased our Bar / BBQ profits with many purchases from kids who never stop eating.

We would like to thank our Head Coach of this programme, Dean Sanders and his assistant Ivan Lawton, for giving up their time to help it succeed and to be able to see the importance of this, going forward, to help the Club bring junior bowlers through to playing pennants. We are very happy with the support of


