Covid rules limit numbers so keep checking if you think you could gain a qualification.

Only one lady in the Club, Brenda Seymour, is currently qualified, which could be, (will be) a problem! Blokes include Michael Nelligan, David McMartin and me, Peter Hurt. Chris Duff-Tytler is now a measurer.

I said "it's our head" and he replied that he wasn't going to move anything. The fact was that, if it's our head, he should have been standing BEHIND the head when our skip was on the mat, not chatting to a team member or inspecting the head. Winter bowls is fun, but let's not get into bad habits.

Here's a related Q and A to remember come Pennants – courtesy of Bowls S.A.

Q – The skip of team "A" is standing on the mat getting annoyed, as the 3rd and skip of team "B" are discussing their last bowl that has just come to rest. Is the skip of team "A" justified?

A – YES! As soon as each bowl comes to rest, possession of the rink will transfer to the opposing player or team after allowing time for marking a toucher as soon as it comes to rest. Law 13.2

UPDATED NOTICE FOR ALL CLUB MEMBERS & PATRONS 13TH MAY 2021

COVID CONTRACT TRACING OBLIGATIONS

The SA Police Commissioner has today announced a crackdown on businesses and patrons failing to abide by the COVID "check in" process when entering a venue.

Everyone is now well versed in that every person who enters a venue such as a Club, must check in using the QR Code system, or if this isn't possible, then a "manual" check in is required.

"Operation Trace" has begun where plainclothes police officers will be patrolling venues to ensure that, firstly, venues are making every effort to ensure patrons are checking in, and secondly, that the patrons themselves are doing so.

As the fines for non-compliance are significant (\$5,090 for Clubs and \$1,090 for patrons), we will make sure members are provided with the appropriate facilities to check in each time when entering the Club.

COVID Marshals:

All COVID Marshals need to be aware of their responsibilities so please support them as they are doing what is asked of them. If there is any spread of this virus, I do not want the Hope Valley Bowling Club to be linked to it.
