FROM THE CHAIRPERSON'S DESK

I would like to thank members for their support and help during my recovery from a hip replacement. I have just started driving again, and plan to be back on the bowling green early July.



At this time of the year, activities at the Club slow down. Social Bowls continue on Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays, although wet weather has already cancelled several days.

Pennant season will be upon us before we know it, so I encourage you to let the Club know of your availability to play pennants in the new season. Subscriptions are due to be paid by 31 July.

We held our Club AGM last month and I congratulate Alan Wheeldon on being elected to the Board and thank Martin Smith who did not seek reelection for his contribution to the Board over many years. At the AGM, members approved expenditure for the installation of an in-ground watering system for all three greens. We are currently looking for Government grants to assist with this expense. Following the change of Government at both State and Federal levels, there are no current grants available, but I notice that, in the recent State Government Budget, \$68.1 million has been allocated to fund community infrastructure projects and \$10 million in sports grants. We have already had a meeting with the Olivia Savvas, our local member, who has offered her support.

The Board will continue to meet monthly to ensure the smooth running of the Club. A copy of the Minutes of each meeting can be found in the folder at the back of the Club.

I am pleased to see that all Government restrictions regarding Covid have been lifted, including the "No Jab, No Play" policy. Again, I would like to thank Nola Manuel for her excellent work in keeping the Club informed of changes.

Sponsorship is an important aspect of the Club - it works in two ways. Firstly, it generates income for the Club, but this only happens if Club members support our Sponsors. During the Covid pandemic we have had several businesses drop their sponsorship due either to financial hardship, or their perceived idea that they are not getting a response for their outlay. By the end of June, the Club will respond to an expression of interest request about entering a side in the proposed Masters (over age 75) pennant division (Saturday competition). HOUSE MANAGER'S REPORT

All supplies that are required for the cleaning and upkeep of the Club are now in stock and stored in a manageable allocated area.

As will have been observed, there is a new cupboard for the *coffee machine*. I have also had the water plumbed directly, into the water reservoir. This water is fed from the plumbing within the bar area and is both filtered and fitted with a non-return valve.



The *Sunday cleaning roster* is running as well as can be expected, with most rostered members turning up for cleaning duties, the introduction of the new scrubbing machine is working well and has provided the potential to reduce the number of volunteers to four instead of five, as is the current case.

Currently we have introduced a system whereby the objective is to leave the clubrooms in a state of preparedness, which will assist the next users to commence their activities within the clubroom, without the hassle of having to re-arrange all the tables and chairs.

The only obstacle so far, is the abundance of advisers all willing to participate - unfortunately some of these advisers are ill-equipped to know exactly what is required to achieve our objective.

I have drawn up two simple layout plans and posted them on the notice board at the rear of the Club. These plans, when followed, make everything so easy for all members using the facilities.

The indoor bowlers are pleased with how the Club is prepared for their arrival to play their indoor games. And when they finish, they also leave the Club ready for social bowls for the next day.

The storage area for supplies and cleaning equipment has been reorganised with a re-vamped hanging space for mops and brooms, a shelf to hold the battery charger has been installed, and all mops have been thoroughly soaked in bleached water and restored to their original colours. They also do not seem to smell so much now. Happy days.

HVBC COACHING 2022

You may be aware that coach Gary Davies is conducting 30-minute, once-off coaching sessions (up to 6 in each group). At these sessions Gary is talking about our off-season practice plan, is conducting a review of your bowling technique and providing tips for individual off-season practice.

QUESTION ASKED OF PETER HURT

I have just received this email from Mick Noonan:

"During an away game towards the end of last season, with about three or four ends to go on each rink, I asked my opposition skipper if he would make sure that the scoreboard is kept up to date after each end because it looked like it was going to be a close finish. He replied something like 'I'm not allowed to touch the scoreboard, that's the job of my second'. I again explained the reason for my request and, after much consternation on his part, he eventually agreed to my request. I would have talked with his team manager had he still argued the point.

I recall one example last season when one of our rinks indicated 20 ends at the end of the game and our second was in the clubhouse!

Is there anything in the rules that would give emphasis to the validity of my request?"

My answer is in **Conditions of Play**, as follows:

5.1 Scorecards: In a fours game the second of each team shall be responsible for the scorecard ... At the end of the game, players who are responsible for maintaining the scorecards must record the time of completion and sign both cards.

It is recommended that seconds confirm the score each end.
