


GREENS MANAGER - JULIE DAVIES:

BREAD TAGS

Thank you to all the people who are still collecting breadtags. Please remember, though, that *only* plastic ones can be sent to our recycler – the cardboard ones can go into the recycling bin. I was pleased this week to see that what began as a small charity in 2018 won an award at the 2024 SA Environment Awards – it was the Working Together Award. What started as a group of just a few people keen to save plastic from landfill and to help



those in need overseas, has since grown into a large national community, achieving significant practical outcomes in terms of recycling and provision of wheelchairs and bringing people together with beneficial social and educational outcomes.

There are now 500+ collection points across Australia. The breadtags are sent to a company called Transmutation in Robe, here in South Australia, where they are recycled into all sorts of bowls, bags and even pens – the only place in the world that makes a pen from recycled breadtags.

The goal was to provide 100 wheelchairs to people in South Africa and, in May, that goal was achieved when 3 wheelchairs were provided to people in an aged care home in Huis Boesmanland. The local school and community over there also collected tags to help the cause. As well as people in aged care, there are many children with severe health and disability issues who have received a wheelchair which has been life changing for them and their carers. So far 12,832 kg of breadtags have been recycled so that is 12 tonnes of plastic that hasn't gone to landfill and has resulted in some excellent outcomes for people in need.

I have just emptied our collection box so more tags are on their way to Robe. I know that we are getting fewer tags these days, but please keep them coming as they soon add up to a significant amount and someone will benefit from our efforts eventually.

INTERESTING/INFORMATIVE BITS FROM PETER HURT

The Club has purchased a new line-sighter which can be used instead of the scope, which many find difficult to use. It's easy to use and can be used in the standing position... so becoming a measurer, or umpire, may be easier for many. I will demonstrate before the next season.

The Ladies are desperate for more measurers and umpires.

They could go to Bowls SA website: Officials: Become an Official: Expression of interest. You will receive first rate training before any assessment. Our Club will refund the fee. (See also Ivan's email re training at Blackwood Bowling Club.)

These questions were asked of me recently. There are always one or two asked every game! See the answers to these 2 questions at the end of this page and see if you were right.

- A. When does "ownership" of the rink change?
 - 1. When the previous bowl comes to rest?
 - 2. When the bowler steps off the mat? OR
 - 3. When the next person steps onto the mat?
- B. Can leads and seconds stand on the rink?



I was recently told of a top match where the umpire used strips of paper to decide on shot where bowls were really close and asked if this was allowed. The short answer is NO! The umpire should have used the feeler gauges. The quote below is from John Roberts, Chairman, National Officiating Advisory Group (NOAG) Bowls Australia:

"The Laws of the Sport are quite clear and are based on "defined events" and if the Laws are silent on an issue then you cannot assume that you can do it."

Answer to Question A: Number 1 (Rule 13.2 – As soon as each bowl comes to rest, possession of the rink will transfer to the opposing player or team after allowing time for marking a toucher.) So, it can be distracting or annoying to call out "great shot; another metre, just a bit more grass, or signal, etc" when the bowl stops because it is NOT your mat!! Rule 13.4 gives consequences for annoying or distracting behaviours!

Answer to Question B: Yes, but they must be at least 1 metre behind the head. See Rule 12 of "Laws of the Sport of Bowls" for further details.

DES BARNES

18-04-1933 - 31-05-2024

Des sadly passed away at home on Friday, 31 May.

Des was an active member of the Hope Valley Bowling Club for many years, was the men's president from 1993 – 1994; he was the treasurer from 1944 – 1999; he received his 25 year membership in 2015 having joined the Club in 1990; Des worked the Ladies' Bar during Thursday pennants; he was the Club's main security person for many years having been called out all hours of the night and day when the alarms went off; and he was awarded Life Membership for all his dedication and loyalty to the Club with everything he did while he was a member. He was well liked and respected by all who knew him.

In the following pages there is a re-print of an article that Andrea put in the Buzz quite a few years ago. There will be many who can relate to Des's story and will remember his time with us.

Our thoughts go out to his family and friends, and we have missed him on the greens for a couple of years now.

Members in profile.....Des Barnes

When Faye came home from the Doctors surgery where she worked as a nurse and explained that a patient had talked to her about taking up bowls, Des never for a moment imagined that he would later spend 20 years playing bowls at Hope Valley.

Over this time he had re-instated five greens, spent many sleepless nights as Club Security Officer, was around when the Club was virtually destitute, played on the infamous C green which was one of the first artificial greens in South Australia, sat on the Men's Committee and the Selection Committee, was elected Life Member, made great friends and generally had a ball. However, this is getting ahead of things and needs to go back to the start.

Born on the cusp of Aries in April 1933 at the Queen Victoria Maternity Hospital, Des Barnes grew up in Prospect. He attended Prospect Primary School and Adelaide Tech from where he graduated and won an apprenticeship at GMH Woodville as a Fitter and Turner. As an old scholar of Adelaide Tech, he maintained close ties with the school even when it was re-located to Glenunga.

In the early 1950's his country called and Des answered (after all National Service was compulsory for all 18 year olds) and he entered his "Biggles" period spending six months in the RAAF at Point Cook in Victoria – he got to fly in Tiger Moths and Wirraways. This was his first experience away from home and he had a great time and made many friends. It was a time that moved him from boyhood to manhood and taught him independence. Des feels that today's young people are less fortunate for not getting this opportunity. On his return, he resumed work at GMH and stayed there for 42 years, even receiving a gold watch on retirement.

Not long after returning from "Natio", Des accepted an invitation to go on a "Blind Date" and met a sweet young girl named Faye. He remembers they went to the cinema at the Regent and, at some stage, he made his move and held hands with her during the movie. This proved to be a good move for in 1956 they married at St. Cuthbert's, Prospect, lived at Broadview and raised two daughters and a son. The family were avid caravaners for years, even more so when the kids moved on. Des raced greyhounds and remembers well his dog, Beckay's, 1st winnings of \$112 in the Gawler Maiden. He is a member of the SA Trotting Club and still has a punt.

In 1979 Des and Faye began their affair with bowls when introduced into the Prospect Bowling Club by "Darkie" Saunders, a then state player, who was a patient at the surgery where Faye worked. They later moved on to Broadview and then in 1990 they settled at Hope Valley opposite "C" green and joined our Club. They both made an impact at their new Club



which was in its infancy. Both played in our top sides — Faye in Premier 1 and Des in many Pennant winning sides (he has a collection of 20+ pennant badges and five "8" badges). He served on many committees, was the first accredited coach at Hope Valley and took the role of Security Officer which involved many call-outs when the alarm was activated, particularly after Club functions when hanging decorations moved and set the alarm going.

Des and Faye helped to lay 5 greens and he remembers well the artificial surface we had on "C" Green which was so affected by our reactive soil that it was not unusual to get a "toucher" from behind kitty. It was banned as a Pennant venue. We have used grass from Toorak, Adelaide, Modbury and Gawler. When "C" Green was first re-planted, Des recalls mowing it with a rotary mower which was the most we could afford. During this era, practice was only possible on one night a week and we practised and often played on rinks hired from Tubemakers, Broadview and St Peters at \$12 per annum per rink. Such was the spirit of the Club that few, if any of the top players who were courted by richer and more recognised clubs, chose to leave Hope Valley.

As a bowler Des reached the finals of both Mixed and Men's Pairs but came second each time. His advice to new bowlers is to:

- **Enjoy** the game and never lose sight that it is a game.
- Make friends with the opposition players.
- **Seek advice from coaches, not other players.**
- Never get on the mat without a clear picture of the shot you are about to play.

Faye died after a 52 year partnership with Des and he was rudderless, except for his bowls and the Hope Valley Club. His great faith in life and the future remained strong and enabled him to bounce back and learn to cook, clean and do the washing although he continually struggled with the ironing. He remained active and outgoing and blessed the day that he and Faye were introduced to lawn bowls.

BARRY'S FAMOUS CURRIED SAUSAGES RECIPE (USING AT LEAST 10 DIFFERENT VEGETABLES)

INGREDIENTS:

8 beef sausages (pref skinless)

1 Granny Smith apple (sliced thinly) 1 tin Waterchestnuts sliced

½ Cup shell pasta

1 tablespoon Keen's Curry Powder 1 tablespoon Cornflour

1 pkt French Onion Soup

1 tablespoon of sugar

Vegetables – Any that you prefer but Barry uses: carrot (sliced),

celery (sliced), parsnip (sliced), broccoli (florets), cauliflower (florets), zucchini (sliced), beans (cut into approx 3 cm lengths), snow peas (string and halve), pumpkin, sweet potato – both cubed if used.

METHOD:

Using an electric frypan add enough water to cover sausages. Turn pan onto simmer. Add French Onion soup mix, sausages, apple, sugar, waterchestnuts. Once it is simmering add carrot, parsnip, celery. Cover with lid. When carrots start to soften but are still a bit firm, add cauliflower and pasta shells. Cover with lid. Continue simmering until carrots are softish then add all the greens. (If you use pumpkin and sweet potato they could probably go in just before the greens.) Replace with lid again.

Add boiling water at any time if the level seems too low.

Mix cornflour and curry powder in a cup with about \(\frac{3}{2} \) cup of water. When the zucchini is almost transparent (approx 2 – 3 mins of simmer time), turn the power OFF of the frypan or remove pan from stove top and gently add curry mix along the sides and around the edges of the pan. Gently stir underneath mixture (I use an egg slice) to blend in but be careful not to mash the vegetables. Turn power back on or replace on stove top with the lid back on and simmer gently for about 10 minutes until all vegetables are cooked and sauce is thick and the flavour has gone through. Stir very gently once or twice.

Serve with heaps of mashed potato. If you want to increase the number of sausages, add more vegetables accordingly but not more French Onion soup. You could use as many vegetables as you like so if adding one of anything looks too little add another. This whole process should take you only ½ an hour or so. If you don't use skinless sausages, you might like to peel the skins off after the initial simmering period when they are soft (I do – Barry doesn't). If you double the curry powder, you need to double the cornflour. I like it hotter.


